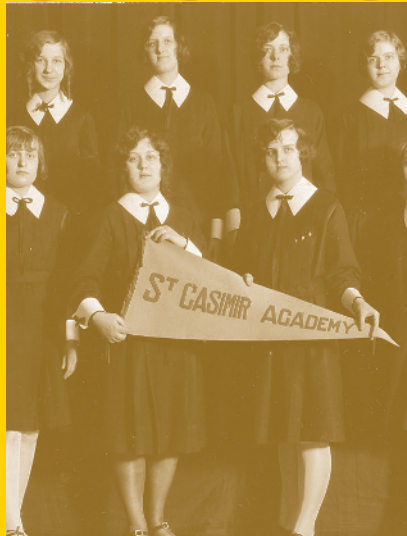

Dear Mr. Rogers ...

You may not remember me, but I wanted to send this letter to let you know how you inspired my life.

I was in 11th grade in 1986 sitting in your ever-so-entertaining World Geography class when we studied the Vietnam War. I remember a film you showed that displayed images of men tearing up their draft notices and I was outraged. I had always had an interest in the military but your class was a defining moment for me to decide to join the United States Marine Corps.

I am grateful for the education I received at Maria High School and for serving this great nation in the Corps. I am raising my family in Colorado now and recently wrote a book regarding four of my dearest friends. They were all Marines in the battle of Iwo Jima island during WWII. The history teacher at our local high school and I teamed up to bring the veterans to her class every semester when the war in the Pacific was covered. The men cherish every minute they spend with the kids. It occurred to me as one of the men turned 88 that future students would not be afforded this opportunity. I became determined to preserve their stories so that these amazing men would live on forever. It was truly a labor of love and the task is finally complete. I was recently promoting it on a local radio station when the host asked me why I joined the Corps and I mentioned you and your class. I searched Maria High School on-line and was pleasantly surprised to learn that you are still a member of the faculty. I hope this letter finds you well. Please accept this book as a token of my gratitude for all you have done for me. I would appreciate if you wouldn't mind placing the second book I provided in the library of Maria High School from this ever thankful alumnus.

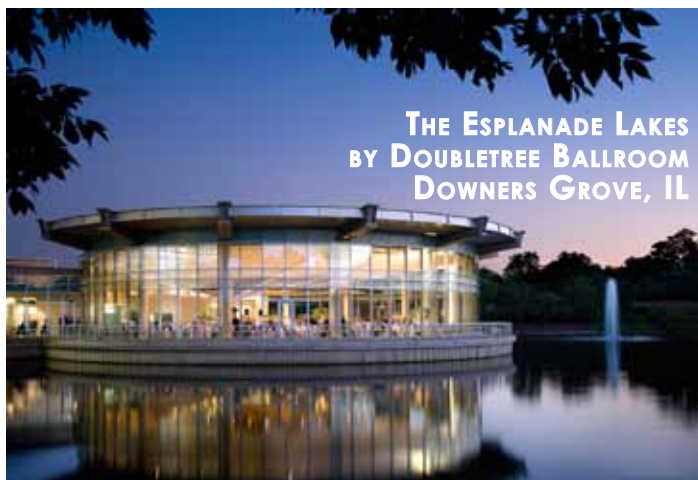
